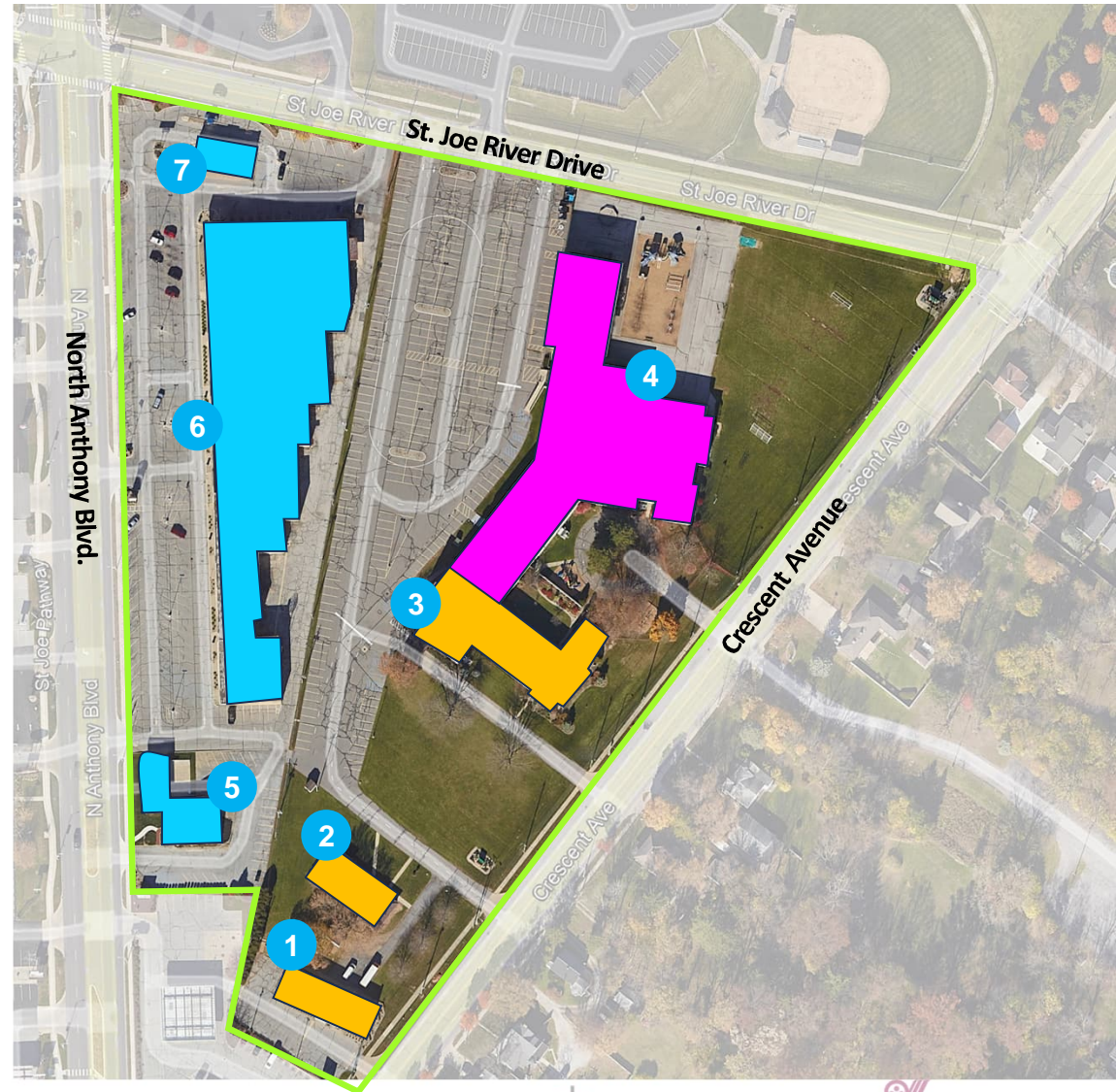

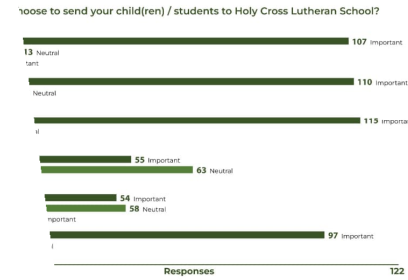

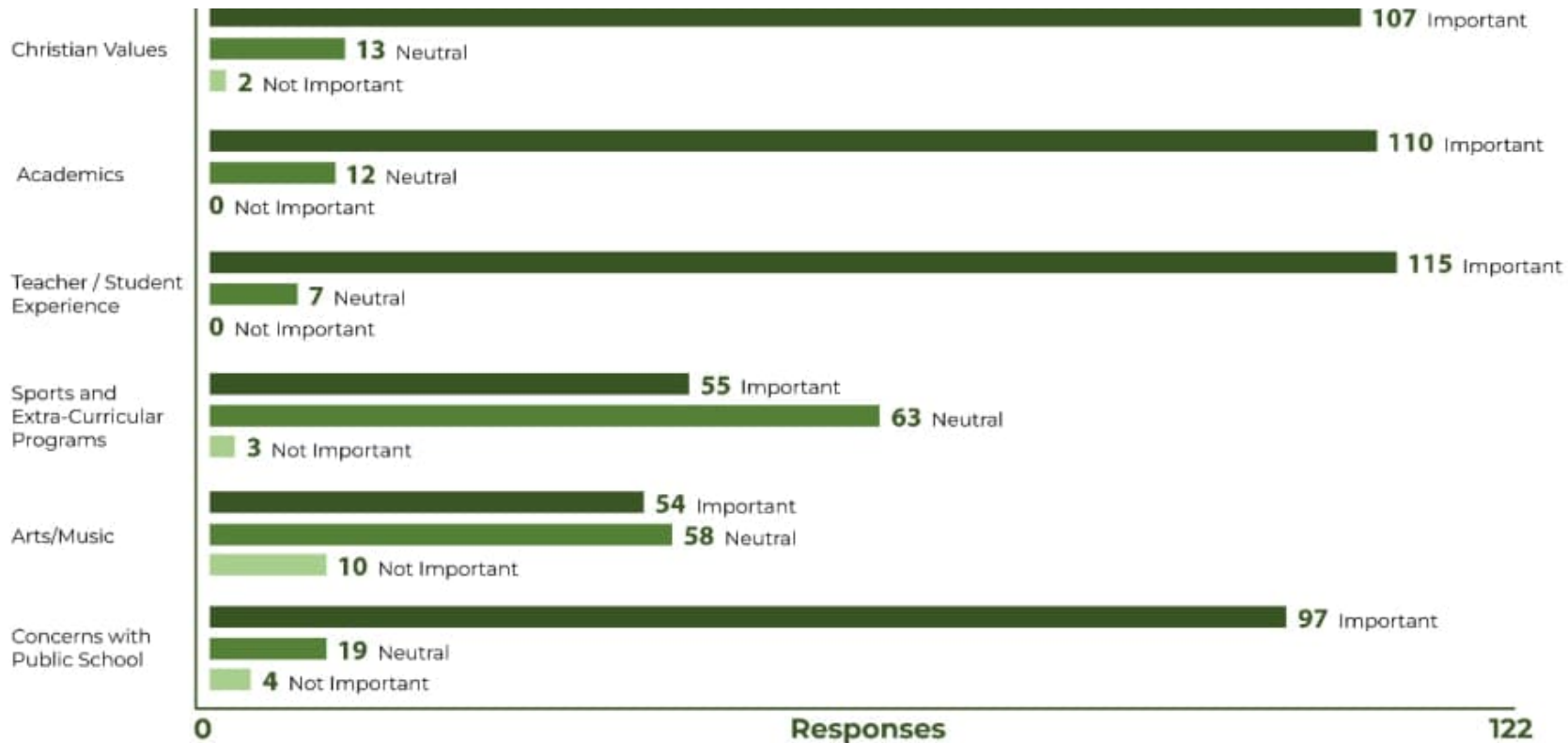
How likely are you to choose to send your child(ren) / students to Holy Cross Lutheran School?

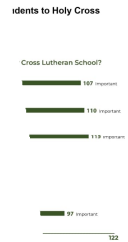
1. Why did you choose to send your child(ren) / students to Holy Cross Lutheran School?

Common Themes in Decision to Send Children/Students to Holy Cross Lutheran School:

- 1. **Christian Environment:**** Many respondents prioritize a Christian environment, where the school instills and reinforces Christian values and beliefs. This includes the desire to have their children surrounded by like-minded families.
- 2. **Community and Sense of Belonging:**** The sense of community, family-like feel, and belongingness are crucial factors. Respondents appreciate the smaller, tight-knit community of students, parents, and faculty that supports each other emotionally and spiritually.
- 3. **Small Class Sizes and Personalized Attention:**** The preference for smaller class sizes is a recurring theme. Respondents value the benefits of a more personal and caring experience, closer teacher-student relationships, and a focus on individual growth.
- 4. **Curriculum and Academic Rigor:**** The desire for a curriculum that keeps students on track and pushes them to learn, along with rigorous academics, is mentioned. Some express a preference for traditional teaching methods over excessive screen time.
- 5. **Athletics and Extracurricular Activities:**** The opportunity for children to be involved in athletics at a younger age is highlighted. Additionally, some express interest in a variety of extracurricular activities beyond traditional sports.

Common Themes in Decision to Send Children/Students to Holy Cross Lutheran School:

6. **Location and Proximity:** Location, including proximity to home and convenience, is a factor for many parents. Some chose Holy Cross due to its location, while others appreciate the school being close to their homes.

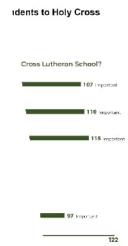
7. **Diversity and Equality:** While some acknowledge the importance of diversity, others express concerns about the lack of it at Holy Cross. There is a desire for the school to embrace diversity and equality.

8. **Cost and Affordability:** While not mentioned as frequently, cost is still a factor for some respondents. It influences their decision, along with considerations like community and location.

9. **Previous Positive Experiences:** Some respondents mention their positive experiences as former students or with their own children attending Holy Cross. These experiences contribute to their decision to choose the school.

10. **Faith-Based Education:** The faith-based aspect is crucial, with respondents choosing Holy Cross specifically for its Christian education over public schools.

11. **Safety and Positive School Environment:** A safe and positive school environment, free from bullying and distractions, is a factor for some parents. They appreciate the dedication of the staff and the positive attitude of the principal.

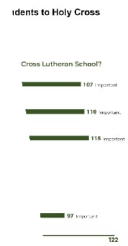

Common Themes in Decision to Send Children/Students to Holy Cross Lutheran School:

12. **Controlled Environment:** Some parents prefer the more controlled environment of a Christian school compared to public schools, particularly with regards to what their children are exposed to in terms of values and teachings.

13. **Unique Offerings:** Specific offerings, such as a preschool for the entire day, are mentioned as unique features that influenced the decision to choose Holy Cross.

In summary, the common themes revolve around the desire for a strong Christian environment, a sense of community, small class sizes, academic rigor, and positive past experiences with the school. Location, affordability, diversity, and a controlled environment are also factors influencing the decision-making process.

2. Common Themes in Order of Mentioned Importance:

- 1. Bathrooms:** Numerous respondents identified the need for improvements in the school's bathroom facilities, including upgrades, ADA compliance, and additional restroom spaces.
- 2. Classrooms:** Several participants emphasized the need for updates and expansions in classrooms, with specific mentions of windows, size, and modernization of teaching tools.
- 3. Gymnasium:** The need for a larger gymnasium was a recurring theme, with suggestions for expansion to support sports programs and events.
- 4. Preschool Facilities:** Many respondents expressed a need for the expansion and improvement of preschool spaces, including separated areas and increased capacity.
- 5. Overall Building Updates:** General updates and modernization of the entire building, both inside and out, were highlighted by numerous participants.

2. Common Themes in Order of Mentioned Importance:

6. **Cafeteria:** Some respondents mentioned the need for cafeteria expansion and updates, including considerations for space and timing during lunch periods.

7. **Library:** Upgrading and expanding the library facilities were mentioned by a few participants.

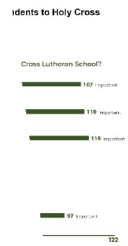
8. **Technology Integration:** While some respondents advocated for limiting technology use in classrooms, others mentioned the need for updated technology infrastructure and resources.

9. **Athletic Facilities:** Besides the gym, participants mentioned a need for updates to locker rooms, weight rooms, and athletic education facilities.

10. **Outdoor Spaces:** Suggestions included the addition of more outdoor playground facilities, shaded areas, and opportunities for outdoor learning.

11. **Safety and Accessibility:** Concerns about safety and accessibility, including ADA compliance and emergency exit plans, were highlighted by a few participants.

12. **Teacher and Student Support:** Some respondents suggested adding resources for mental health support, academic struggles, and a full-time school nurse.

14. **Traffic Flow and Parking:** A few participants mentioned improvements in traffic flow, parking, and the expansion of the parking lot to accommodate more cars during pickup times.

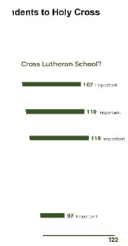
15. **Community Engagement:** A participant expressed a desire for the school to be more pedestrian-friendly and engage with the local community.

16. **Financial Considerations:** Some participants raised concerns about financial aspects, such as realistic planning, fundraising, and avoiding additional financial burden on families.

17. **Retaining School's Distinctive Features:** Several participants emphasized the importance of maintaining the school's distinctive features, such as small class sizes and a Christ-centered education.

18. **Diversity in Facilities:** A few respondents suggested expanding facilities to accommodate a variety of activities, including technology instruction, science laboratories, and a stage for dramatic arts.

19. **Overall Aesthetics and Modernization:** Modernizing aesthetics and ensuring the overall appearance of the school was mentioned in terms of creating a positive learning environment.



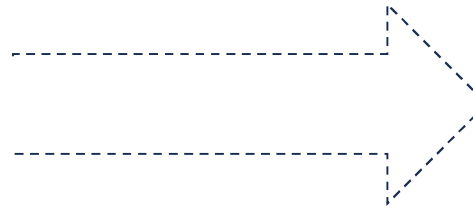

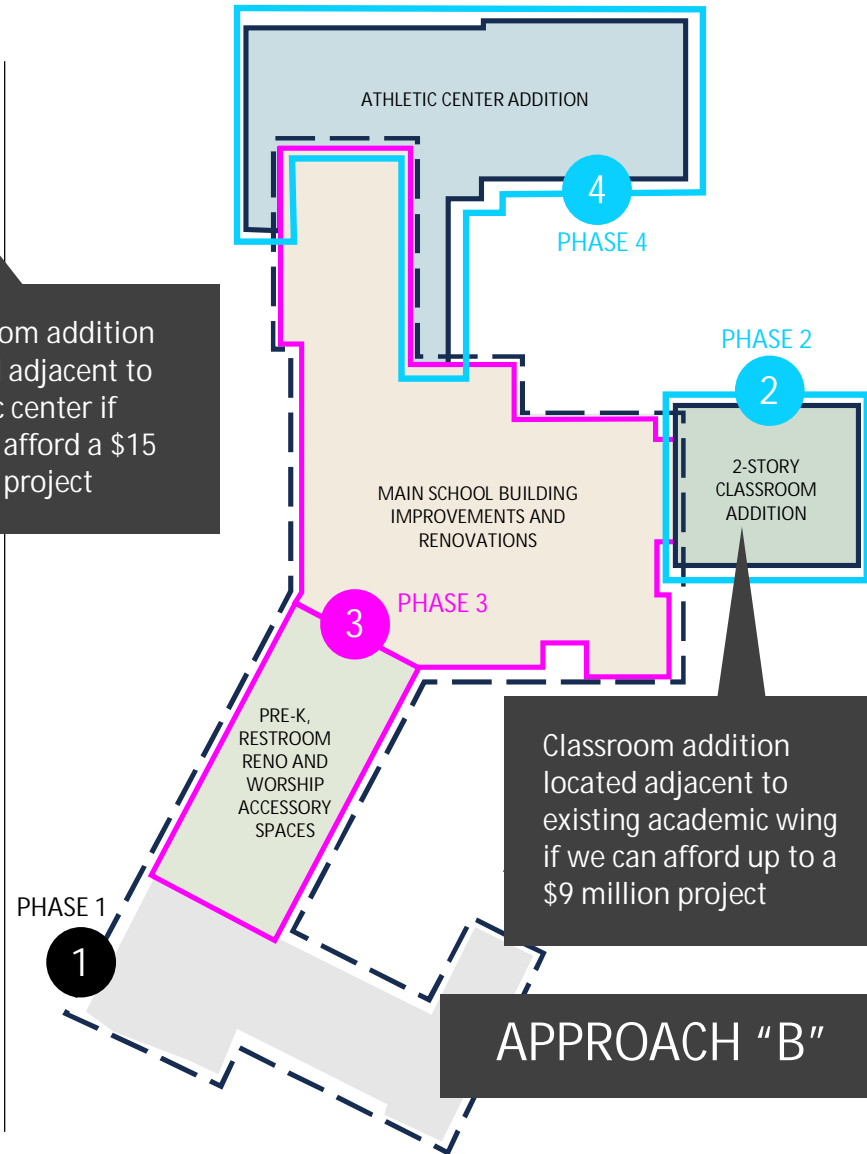

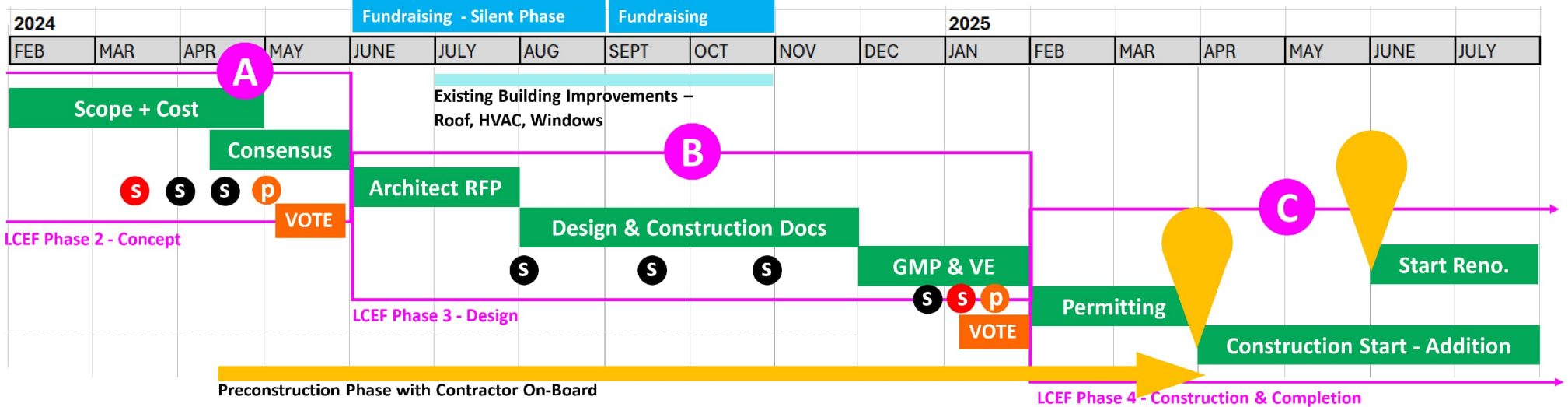
